Secretary's Corner: Fantasy Draught Draft Recap

The club held its inaugural Fantasy Draught Draft on October 4th at King Street Brewing. Having never participated in any sort of fantasy sports league, I had no idea what to expect, but I decided to give it a try anyway. There were nine of us, though one player was creating an ingredient lineup for someone else as well as himself. There were also a

couple people who wanted to be part of the draft but weren't going to have time to actually make a beer, so if you missed the draft and want to see what you can do with one of the extra ingredient lists, email an officer for more information.


We began by drawing numbers 1-10 to determine the order participants would get to pick ingredients, alternating between counting up and counting down. Each person took turns picking ingredients, starting with their base grains, though we did not all have to choose each category of ingredient in the same order. The rules of the draft required everyone to have at least seven ingredients, with certain categories being mandatory and others optional. There was somewhat of a learning curve given my relative inexperience with both fantasy sports and brewing, but in the end, I came away with the ingredients for an imperial chocolate peanut butter porter.

We tentatively agreed on judging the results at the February meeting to give everyone a chance to brew, especially because the beers need to be at least 7% ABV. Thanks to Adam Sikorski for introducing us to this fun event!

Membership By The Numbers

Each summer, when purchasing liability insurance via the American Homebrewers

Association (AHA), the club needs to count our members. For purposes of the AHA insurance policy, the club had 176 members in the last quarter of our membership year (July-September). At \$4.48 per member, the liability insurance payment of \$788.48 is one of the club's large expenses.

In order to track membership trends from a club perspective, one needs to look at member totals by category. GNBC has two categories of membership, annual and lifetime, and each membership payment covers one or two related individuals in a household. The 176 members reported include:

- 38 lifetime members (22 lifetime membership payments)
- 138 annual members (78 annual membership payments) •
- 176 total members

Our new member year began October 1st. Statistics for the new year to date are:

- 40 lifetime members (23 lifetime membership payments)
- 73 annual members (41 annual membership payments) •
- 113 total members

Compared to last year's totals, the club is 37 annual memberships behind. However, the rate of membership renewals, and new annual memberships, seems comparable to recent years. The recent lifetime membership is the first in several years.

Current membership cards are required for the December Holiday party and the January Industry Meeting, which should stimulate renewals. I will be at the club meeting on Tuesday November 15th and can produce laminated membership cards on site for renewals (payment in cash, check or via Paypal. A PayPal account is not required, only a credit card).
