Brewers Association e-books* at the Anchorage Public Library

Though I've often used the public library as a source for books on beer and brewing, I've been more a books buyer than a book borrower when it comes to beer and brewing. I was recently surprised when I noticed that the Hoopla Digital service at Anchorage Public Library includes 52 titles from the Brewers Association Catalog ("Brewers Publications").

By my count, the 52 titles are about two thirds of the current Brewers Association sales catalog. Excluded are a few titles of interest to operating breweries, such as volumes on brewery finance, safety, and human resources/personnel management.

The titles I most associate with the Brewers Publications imprint are in the collection at Hoopla Digital: the style guides, the beginner books, the "think" books and the yeast, malt, hops and water books. A few titles: Designing Great Beers by Ray Daniels, Radical Brewing by Randy Mosher, Brew Like a Monk by Stan Hieronymus and Historical Brewing Techniques by Lars Marsius Garshol.

How can you use Hoopla Digital? Access requires an Anchorage Public Library card, available to residents of the municipality (and non-residents for an annual fee). The Hoopla Digital app is available at Android and iPhone app stores. Each calendar month an account holder may borrow up to seven titles on Hoopla Digital. E-book loans last 21 days unless returned earlier –then the title is no longer accessible unless borrowed again. (Movie and audio loans have shorter durations.) Individual titles are never unavailable because someone else has borrowed that title.

Access to downloaded titles does not require live internet access. Downloads from desktop and laptop computers are not permitted. One can, however, access Hoopla Digital e-books (and movies) from laptops and desktops, assuming Internet access, by pointing a browser to hoopladigital.com and entering the login associated with one's library. For many e-books, especially those with photographs or illustrations or tables of data, I find the desktop display more satisfactory than the screen on a phone or on a tablet.

The 52 e-books mentioned above are in the Hoopla Digital database, not in the main library catalog. At the Hoopla Digital advanced search function, enter "Brewers Publications" in the publisher field. Alternatively, search an individual title and then click on "Brewers Publications" above (or near) the book cover.

Have fun browsing those books published by the Brewers Association! To spread a wider net on our hobby in Hoopla Digital, search on "beer brewing" and retrieve more than 300 other e-books (and audio books) from other publishers.

- Bottles may not have any writing or labels on the glass Multiple entries: label each set on bottle cap or with sticky note
