members are patient. I rarely receive reports or complaint about delays in receipt of membership cards and club e-mails.

If you paid for a GNBC membership using PayPal or a personal check and do not receive a membership card within three weeks, please tell me by sending email to <u>membership@greatnorthernbrewers.org</u>. Travel or special circumstances may occasionally delay my response, but members should expect to receive a membership card within three weeks. Three weeks allows four days for delivery via post office.

From time to time, I learn that members are not receiving email from the club, for one of several reasons. For example, when I began doing membership in 2020, I missed a step in the first six addresses I entered in the the club's email list. I would have been grateful to have received a problem report, even phrased as a complaint, rather than later discovering my error.

TAP = Training for Alcohol Professionals

In Alaska, a valid TAP card is required for those persons who serve alcohol at a licensed establishment and at events such as beer festivals and charity functions. Registrations are good for three years. Obtaining the TAP card requires taking a class and passing a written test with a score of at least 85% correct answers. The TAP class takes about four hours, followed by the test. After getting one's initial TAP card, one can take the test without re-taking the class. Current fees for the class

and test are \$40 for employees of CHARR members, \$55 for others. The class fee includes a study guide summarizing Alaska law and good practices for serving alcohol. The renewal certification test, without the class, costs \$45 for employees of CHARR members, \$60 for others.
